

## Criteria 3- Research, Innovations and Extension

- The college has utilized grants from non-government organizations to fund various research projects conducted by the faculty members.
- Three national conferences were organized by the institute, with participation from faculty members, students, and attendees from other colleges and states.
- Students, particularly those enrolled in Self Finance courses, are required to undergo internships and research programs, and based on their experiences, they must prepare and submit project reports.
- Students are actively encouraged to participate in extension activities organized by NSS and DLLE, such as blood donation camps, book donation drives, plastic recycling initiatives, road safety campaigns, pulse polio drives, tree plantation programs, and health awareness activities.
- The college regularly organizes seminars, workshops, and conferences to raise awareness about intellectual property rights (IPR) and other knowledge transfer initiatives.
- The college has established collaborations with industries and institutes in various fields, including hospitality, medicine, law, and management colleges. These collaborations provide students and faculty members with opportunities for student exchange and faculty exchange programs, expanding their knowledge and benefiting both parties.
