


1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges (SWOC)

Strengths

Weakness

- Less number of collaborations and linkages at International level.

- Being affiliated college no scope for curriculum revision, assessment, evaluation, examination reforms and structure of courses.
- The HEI is unaided self-finance institute which leads to limited financial freedom.
- The college doesn't receive any grants from government it's a selffunded institution. The fees of the students are the major source of income for HEI to run with day to day activities.

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Opportunities

- To go for the extension of building by constructing and extending another two floors as the HEI has already received the CC for the extension from all the component bodies.
- To sign and have more collaborations for faculty and students exchange programmes and research.
- To enhance research output by undertaking more research projects for faculties and students and also having funds from various NGOS for the same.
- As the college has a good alumni base which has to be activated this can be used for the college development and student support mechanism.
- To introduce a research journal at institutional level which might help the college enrolled students a better platform in research.
- To introduce new courses for the commerce and science students as it has been already included in the perceptive plan of affiliating university.
- To motivate students for sports and other physical activities.

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Challenges

- Providing personal attention to the diverse needs of large number of students because of the large student strength in undergraduate programmes
